

Dear Sisters,



Lenten Reflections - 2018 (Eunice - Ibvm).

We are usually surrounded by so much inner and outer noise that it's hard to truly hear our God calling us to join him in his plan of salvation for mankind. And so he lures us into the desert every Liturgical year through the mother church who gives us an opportunity to walk Forty days with Christ, in preparation to suffer with him in his passion and eventually rise with him to a new life. It's a time to move away from ordinary busyness to a quiet reflective time. To leave behind the baggage of unforgiveness and carry out Christ's mission of reconciliation by first reconciling with myself, my attitudes, my feelings, what I like and do not like about myself; Reconciling with others: my family and relations, my community, those that have hurt me, those that I find difficult to love in all honesty, those that do not allow me to love them, those that do not love me in return and lastly but most importantly, putting things right with God.



It's a time to come back like the prodigal son in the Gospel of Luke 15:11-32 remembering that no matter how far I move away from our loving Father, he is patiently waiting to accept me back. He promises not to remember my sins of old in Heb 8:12 and Isa 43:25 and by the end of the desert days, make all things new in my life through the resurrection of our Lord.



His Holiness pope Francis encourages us to reflect on 1 Corinthians 12:26. When we hear the word of God and receive the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, there we become what we receive: the body of Christ. In this body there is no room for indifference which so often seems to possess our hearts. For whoever is of Christ belongs to one body, and in him we cannot be indifferent to one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored; all the parts share its joy. It is this union of hearts and minds that our constitution invites us to, echoing these words to the Corinthians.

Am invited to reflect on my almsgiving: how available am I to those who need my time? Energies? a listening ear? physical, spiritual, social and emotional support?



Reflect on my prayer life; is my prayer life reflected in the way I live? What are the fruits of my prayer? Am I giving prayer precedence in my life? Do I rely on God for wisdom and direction always or at my convenience?



Reflect on my fasting: what am I invited to abstain from? What am I invited to feast on? (things to do that ordinarily I wouldn't do voluntarily that serve the good of others)?



So, as we enter the desert, Jesus invites each one of us to meet him in the sacrament of penance (and to approach the sacrament not as a torture chamber, but a place in which the Lord's mercy motivates us to do better-*Amoris laetitia*) to rid ourselves of unnecessary baggage.



Spend more time with Jesus in the Gospel this Lent. With our eyes fixed on the glory of the resurrected Christ, let us enter the desert with a clear goal that whatever we ask in Jesus name will be granted us for the greater glory of God.
